



Local companies move mountains for EarthShare and sustainability

EarthShare Oregon exists because business partners, like these four listed below, care about offering their employees an easy way to give back to the environment. Here are a few of the most successful campaigns of the past year:

Burgerville

When Burgerville, a Pacific Northwest fast food restaurant chain, decided to add EarthShare to their employees' charitable giving campaign, we assumed it would take time for employees to learn about EarthShare. But in only the second year, Burgerville employees have embraced the dozens of environmental nonprofits that are EarthShare members. Burgerville employees raised almost \$62,000 through their giving campaign, with 43% of all employees donating!

Kaiser Permanente

The employees of Kaiser Permanente are some of EarthShare's longest-standing and most generous donors. In February 2010, EarthShare honored Kaiser Permanente with an award recognizing their gifts – \$1.2 million given over several years. Kaiser has been able to raise this impressive sum because of its army of active employee campaigners, prominent fundraising and awareness raising events, and the company's employee gift matching program.

Eugene Water & Electric Board (EWEB)

This longtime business partner of EarthShare has a history of continuous growth in their donations. EWEB employees have given \$150,000 since 1996 to EarthShare – in recent years, they've more than tripled what they donated back in 1996. EWEB also provides crucial volunteer support to EarthShare member groups in Eugene that few other companies could provide. How many other employee groups can bring a dump truck and heavy equipment to a volunteer service day, as they did for The Nature Conservancy last year?

Invitrogen, a Life Technologies company

This company and its employees began donating to EarthShare Oregon 13 years ago, when it was called Molecular Probes. Over time, they have changed their name but their giving spirit stayed unchanged. Invitrogen's 300 employees have donated more than \$50,000 to EarthShare over the years. This stellar giving history exists because of their employee campaigners, who work very hard to get their co-workers giving every year. In 2009, Invitrogen employees made sustainability and the environment a top priority – hosting workshops, a native plant sale and bike tune-up station during Earth Week. This increased emphasis on eco-friendly activities has brought more donors to EarthShare than ever before.

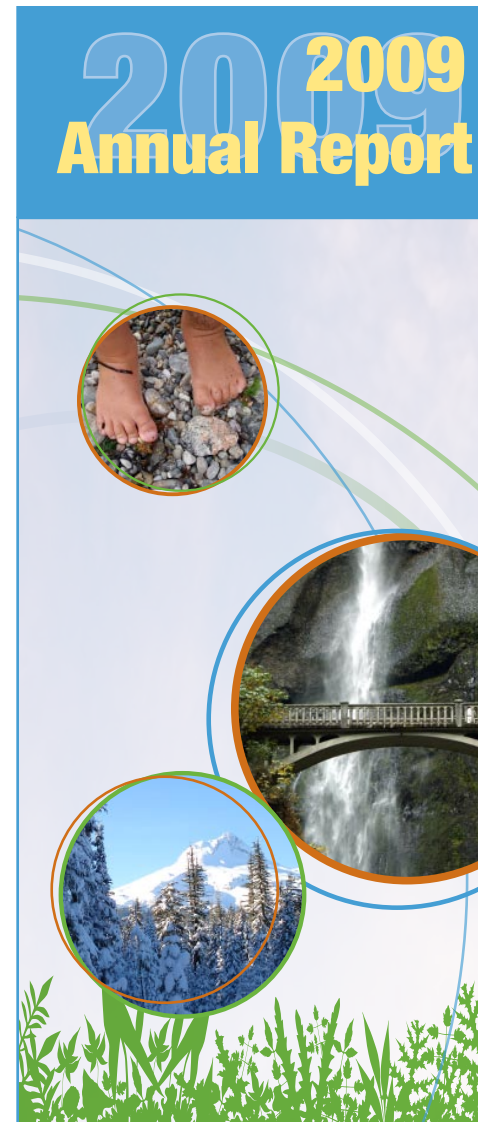
Before she could even walk on her own, I took my daughter for a hike on the Oak Island Nature Trail on Sauvie Island. She held my hand and toddled down the trail, so happy to be outside in the summer sun. I can't imagine a better way to spend an afternoon than wandering on a trail with my family at one of Oregon's special places.

I also can't imagine how close we came to losing places like the Oak Island Nature Trail. Just a few decades ago, more than 4,000 acres of Sauvie Island was slated to be divided up into five-acre parcels for homebuilding and suburban development. Now, it's protected, much of it farmland offering local, healthy food directly to Oregonians. Another 12,000 acres of it is now a wildlife preserve, open to the public to hike, birdwatch, or catch a few rays of sun.

This wonderful legacy we have today exists partly because of environmental groups like those that EarthShare Oregon supports. The work they do to protect places such as Sauvie Island, Opal Creek, Mt. Hood National Forest, and the Metolius River is why I share my time as a board member of EarthShare, and why my family makes an annual donation through EarthShare.

It thrills us to give through EarthShare and have 70 environmental organizations benefit from that one gift. There are so many wonderful conservation groups in the state – my husband and I find it hard to choose between them. Giving through EarthShare makes this choice so much simpler.

Because EarthShare's donors and business partners share in the responsibility to protect our environment, we can enjoy our favorite places. Because Oregonians share our resources, the quality of life that makes Oregon special will be there for me, for my daughter, and for generations to come.

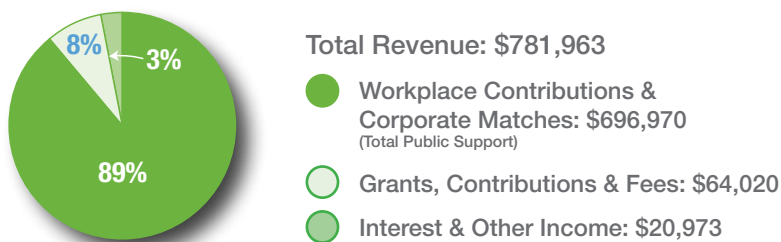
Financial Statement 2009 — Volunteer, vendors ensure careful financial management

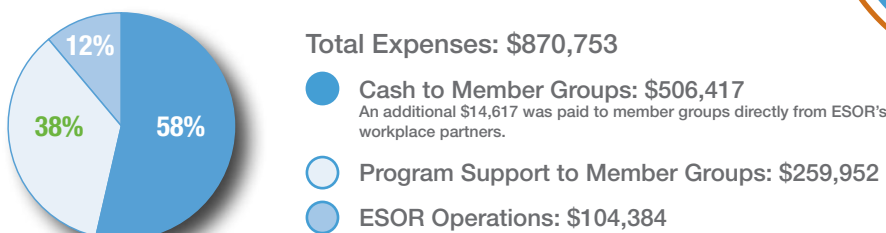
