



## What a Donation Can Do

**Audubon Society of Portland** – \$3.50 per paycheck will provide a day of nature-based summer camp to a deserving child.

**Bark** – \$5.50 per paycheck provides the resources needed to organize and host a free public hike for a group of future forest protectors.

**Beyond Toxics** – \$2 per paycheck will help Beyond Toxics travel to a remote rural community to educate and engage them in environmental health advocacy and in public policy decisions.

**Bicycle Transportation Alliance** – \$2.50 per paycheck provides 10 helmets for BTA's Bike Safety Education program.

**BRING Recycling** – \$7.50 per paycheck will allow BRING to reach 67 people with its award-winning waste reduction education program.

**Columbia Riverkeeper** – \$10.50 per paycheck will support two organizers and outreach materials for a four-hour clean water campaign event with local citizen groups.

**Forest Service Employees for Environmental Ethics** – \$6.25 per paycheck will pay for FSEEE to monitor a specific timber sale or grazing allotment. This will ensure grazing and tree harvests follow rules that protect our public lands from improper use.

**Friends of the Columbia Gorge** – \$2 per paycheck educates one middle-school student in a multi-day Columbia River Gorge educational field trip.

**Friends of Trees** – \$4.25 per paycheck can ensure the planting of six native trees or shrubs in an urban natural area in honor or in memory of someone.

**Greenbelt Land Trust** – \$5 per paycheck enables GLT to hold an invasive weeds workshop and training for volunteers.

**Hells Canyon Preservation Council** – \$3.25 per paycheck will purchase supplies for one wilderness restoration project in eastern Oregon.

**Institute for Applied Ecology** – \$2 per paycheck will seed an acre of prairie habitat with native wildflowers for butterflies and other pollinators.

**Klamath-Siskiyou Wildlands Project** – A \$10 per paycheck provides one training session for volunteer public land stewards.

**McKenzie River Trust** – \$12 per paycheck will provide weed management on one acre of floodplain land on the banks of the Willamette River for a full year.

**Native Plant Society** – \$20 per paycheck fully funds a grant that will help students or faculty complete research that will conserve native plant species (often endangered species) and critical habitats in Oregon.

**The Nature Conservancy** – \$3 plants one tree at our Willamette Confluence Preserve and other Conservancy restoration sites.

**Northwest Center for Alternatives to Pesticides** – \$3.25 per paycheck will protect more than 800 different species of native bees.

**Northwest Earth Institute** – \$1 per paycheck allows NWEI to conduct a course mentor training for ten volunteers. Many of these volunteers go on to launch ten or more courses, engaging over 100 people each in taking action on behalf of the planet.

**Opal Creek Ancient Forest Center** – \$2.25 per paycheck subsidizes a two-night outdoor school program for a student from a low-income school.

**Oregon Environmental Council** – \$10 per paycheck helps us educate Oregonians about healthy, affordable ways to reduce health damaging toxic pollution in their homes.



## What a Donation Can Do

**OLCV Education Fund** – \$4 per paycheck will allow outreach to 100 voters, to remind them to participate in important elections that impact environmental policy.

**Oregon State Parks Foundation** – \$1 per paycheck will pay for two students in a K-8 class from a low- to moderate-income community to have a day in an outdoor science lab.

**Oregon Wild** – \$4.25 per paycheck provides the ability to create maps and supporting materials to advocate for areas in need of protection.

**Pacific Rivers** – \$4.25 per paycheck covers production costs for 50 copies of Pacific Rivers' film "Behind the Emerald Curtain."

**Recycling Advocates** – \$4.25 per paycheck sponsors a year of Recycling Advocates membership for a graduating class of Master Recyclers in Washington, Clackamas or Multnomah counties. Master Recyclers educate others about how to prevent waste.

**Renewable Northwest** – \$4.25 per paycheck will cover the cost of making an educational presentation to two local community groups on the environmental and societal benefits of using green, renewable energy instead of power produced by fossil fuel plants.

**Sierra Club Foundation, Oregon Chapter** – \$2 per paycheck will bring a new desert support volunteer along on a service outing to Steens Mountain, to help restore the desert wilderness and aid wildlife by pulling up old barbed-wire fence.

**Solar Oregon** – For \$2 per paycheck, a donor can provide a month of mobile access to Mapdwell, which evaluates any house's solar potential. It allows users to pull up their own house, adjust where solar panels would go and the size of the system, and see the projected payback immediately.

**Tualatin Riverkeepers** – \$20 per paycheck purchases five canoe paddles and lifejackets for outreach paddling events.

**WaterWatch of Oregon** – \$7.50 per paycheck would pay for one staff attorney day in Salem advocating for balanced water policies and healthy rivers before the Oregon Water Resources Commission or the Governor's natural resources policy staff or legislators.

**Wetlands Conservancy** – \$6.25 per paycheck purchases enough native wetland plants to replant 1/4 acre of wetland.

**Willamette Riverkeeper** – \$2.25 per paycheck enables staff members to lead a Willamette River paddle trip that will connect people to the river and inspire many to become River Stewards.
